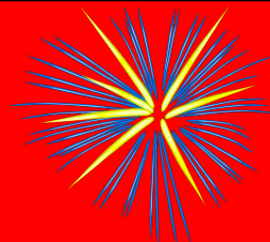

The Town has a great looking line-up of entertainment and fun for July 1st. I would like to wish all North Rustico

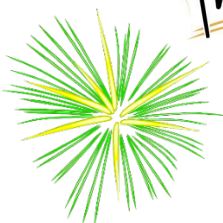

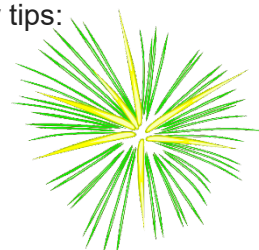
A message from Parks Canada

A mobile surf guard service will have a regular presence moving along the coastline from east to west, evaluating conditions, sharing safety messaging with beachgoers, and responding to calls as required at supervised and non-supervised beaches.

During the summer months, Parks Canada posts on the PEI National Park Facebook page to advise when dangerous surf conditions are present. Visitors can also check PEI ParksNow (pc.gc.ca/apps/parksnow) for information about surf conditions and parking in advance of a visit to PEI National Park.

Ultimately, visitor safety is a shared responsibility. Water users are responsible for learning about ocean hazards and making informed decisions when planning their visit to PEI National Park. Safety tips:

1. Never swim alone.
2. Keep children at arm's length at all times when in the water.
3. Opt for a supervised beach.
4. Observe surf conditions and follow surf guard advice.
5. If waves are present, be aware of the possibility of rip currents.
6. No inflatables. Ever.
7. Be informed about rip currents on the north shore of PEI. Watch the video "Rip Currents – the Hidden Danger" – available on YouTube to learn more about rip currents, how to identify them and what to do if caught in one. <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=alPBqhvEGzg>
