- Autumn Lane Subdivision Update and Lot 45 Future Plans
 - Deputy CAO Marley Doucette gave the council an update on

Deputy CAO Marley Doucette explained to council that there had been very little serious interest in Lot 45 but that there may be some with the Housing meeting happening and asked Council to think about what they would like to see happen to it in the future.

- Trail Development
 - Deputy CAO Marley Doucette explained to Council that we received a \$2,500 grant from Frank Cowen Company for the trail development. Staff received an email from the Province about a new fund opening that the trails may fit into. Deputy CAO Marley Doucette will contact the Province to see if our trails would qualify. CAO Patsy Gamauf explained to Council that she met with Pam Schuurman and she thought that if we can get the Mi'kmaq confederacy on board then there will be funding available. Deputy CAO Marley Doucette asked Councilor Michelle Pineau if she would reach out to the Mi'kmaq confederacy to get a meeting with us in order to see if there are any ties to the land. Deputy CAO Marley Doucette will send Councilor Michelle Pineau information and Councilor Michelle Pineau will report back to Council.

Mayor Les Standen brought up to Council that their Norton Antivirus will be expiring soon. Staff asked everyone to bring their computer into the next meeting and Staff will renew the subscription.



Hello Chief Administrative Officers,

The Government of PEI released a Sustainable Transportation Action Plan in early November. It has 27 action items to be implemented over five years in the areas of transit, vehicles, active transportation and community design.

Recently, an Active Transportation Fund was announced. This fund will help build new walking and bike paths, widen paved shoulders, and better connect existing walking and cycling trails to improve and grow active transportation networks.

An Active Transportation Working Group (the Working Group) has been established to guide this fund over the next five years.

Public consultation and community engagement will be necessary to understand where active transportation infrastructure is most needed. There will be a consultation and engagement process in the coming year to better understand the various needs across PEI and to identify priorities. We will be in contact with you again at a later date to coordinate your hopeful participation.
